

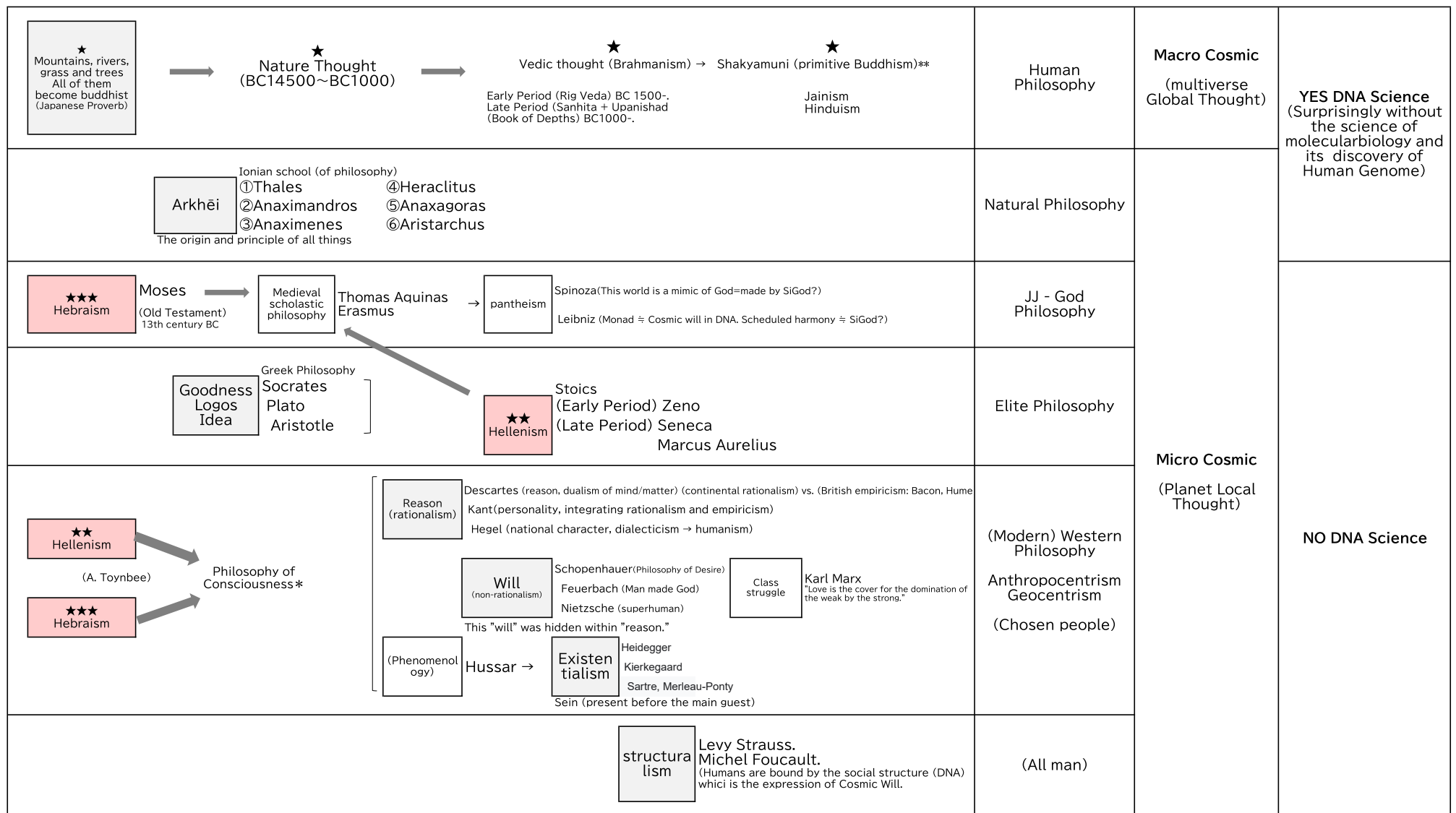
## Why do we need philosophy now?

The Greek epic poet Hesiod, in his "Labors and Days," tells the story of the five ages of man (the Golden, Silver, Bronze, Heroic, and Iron Ages). In the "Age of Bronze," the gods of justice (Themis or Justes), who remained in the human world until the end, were dismayed by the behavior of human beings and returned to the other world of gods, thus the fall to the "Iron Age where power in justice. About 2,700 years have passed since then. Human behavior has not improved but deteriorated, and we now live in fear of nuclear power, uncontrolled genetic modifications, and the possibility of an unexpected decision of AI, all of which we invented. The times are deteriorating to the worse, and we have finally entered the "Age of Lead". The simple question is "Are we happy?". Religion answers "How to save". Economics answers "How to survive". Philosophy answers "How to live". Today we need a "Human Philosophy" that provides the principles for living in the "Age of Lead".

## Assumption

Life is defined as "carbon life (C-life)" that replicates.  
 The purpose of life is "self-DNA replication". This is referred as "Cosmic Will".  
 Cosmic Will is written(coded) in the DNA of all life.  
 The human genome can be titled "greed and jealousy" in Japanese.  
 ※The human genome is a code of about 3 billion base pairs written in the 46 chromosomes in the nucleus of human cells with four bases of G,C,A,T.  
 Language is a misnomer for "greed and jealousy."  
 ※It hides the fact that Cosmic Will has only one life purpose which is self-DNA replication.  
 The role of the virus is to spread DNA/RNA and they are stored in comets.  
 The universe is a container(home) for C-life.  
 ※Stars provide elements (food for C-life), and planets are places for C-life to multiply and diversify.

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# Human Philosophy” in the Lead Age

It was Rene Descartes, the father of "modern Western philosophy," who said, "If you really want to understand the 'thoughts' of 'people,' pay attention to their 'actions,' not their 'words.'

If we follow Descartes and pay attention to biological human "actions" instead of "words (what they wrote and left behind)," the increase in human numbers is the greatest "action" result in human history. It is estimated that humans emerged about 300,000 years ago as Homo sapiens. The human population has multiplied tremendously and is now about to reach a population of about 8 billion individuals. It is known that humans began to increase their population rapidly when they started farming and pastoralism more than 10,000 years ago. Counting from that time, the human population has increased about 100,000-fold. Judging from this fact, we can conclude that the real "idea" of "man" is "self-propagation. Descartes' definition of "person" is "I think, therefore I am (cogito ergo sum)," but as far as "actions" and not "words" are concerned, "person" is simply a "self-propagating" human life." I reproduce therefore I am (procreatio ergo sum)."

If we reflect on this conclusion in Cartesian terms, the human "language" may be there to conceal this fact ("self-propagation"). If the result of human life activity is "self-propagation," the self-esteem of "man" will be damaged. Therefore, it is thought that humans may have acquired "language" in the last 50,000 to 70,000 years to seek a way of life that is not only "self-propagation," thereby camouflaging the true "purpose of life," "self-propagation."

Today, I would like to talk a little from this perspective, based on the bold but possible molecular biological assumption that "people" are basically viruses. The human genome was fully decoded in 2003. This is a major breakthrough in the history of science, comparable to Copernicus' geocentric hypothesis. This discovery revealed that the human genome, like the genomes of other living organisms, is written with four bases (G, C, A, and T for DNA and G, C, A, and U for RNA). The genome of all life was found to be written with only five bases (GCAT or U, like letters). This means that the idea of "all plants, all trees, all life, all things are created by Buddha" that all life is contained in everything is not just an idea, but has a scientific basis behind it. Later, it was discovered that about 46% of the human genome is of viral origin. About half is of viral origin. It is no wonder that "people" who "act" according to such a human genome live, or "act," in a viral way.

I offer five bold, but quite scientifically based, hypotheses for the "human philosophy."

First, carbon life abounds in this and other universes. This is the multiverse panspermia theory.

Second, the universe (multiverse) is a container for the continuation of carbon life (DNA). The stars supply the nutrients for carbon life in the form of elements, and the planets supply the growth sites for carbon life. This forms the stationary universe.

Third, the life purpose of carbon life (cosmic will) is encoded in DNA, which is written in four bases. It (the cosmic will) is only one thing: the continuation of life, the replication of DNA and RNA.

Fourth, viruses serve to transport (inject) genomes into life. Viruses are mainly stored in comets. The infusion of viral DNA or RNA allows life to achieve diversity.

Fifth, we do not deny that carbon life was created and introduced into the steady state universe by the creator of silicon life.

With the above as a preface, I will talk about today's main topic, the philosophy of man. It is a philosophy based on rigorous science. It is not a religion. It is not salvation. Philosophy is a way of thinking and talking about the principles of how human beings ("man") should live in the age. It is not about some people, but it must be about all people in the world. Otherwise, it is a biased philosophy. This is the difference between "human philosophy" and "modern Western philosophy," which targets only a few people. Another major difference is that "human philosophy" is based on the assumption of pan-life and pan-cosmos (panspermia). In contrast, "modern Western philosophy" assumes a pan-human, pan-earth premise. In other words, it is anthropocentric and geocentric. Human philosophy" is global and macro-cosmic, while "modern Western philosophy" is very local and micro-cosmic.

Let me begin with the question of the times. What is the most important question for human beings today? This must be asked first. If we do not know the problem, we will not find the answer. If there is no problem, there is no need for philosophy, which is the answer. Peace and tranquility? Population growth? Distribution of wealth? Discrimination? Inequality? Environmental destruction? Depletion of resources and energy? What are the biggest problems for human beings in this day and age? If we identify this, we can think about what is the basic pillar of human thought for living in the midst of these issues. Again, what is the idea on which people around the world depend and live in the times in which we live today? It is "human philosophy" that asks, thinks, and talks about this. It is not a religion. Religion seeks salvation. Human philosophy is not salvation. It is the philosophy of Homo sapiens built on a correct understanding of the purpose of life (the continuation of DNA) as revealed by rigorous science.

The biggest problem for human existence is the environmental pollution that has already occurred irreversibly. The most serious form of environmental pollution is nuclear power plants. It is the proliferation of radioactive materials from spent nuclear fuel produced by the operation of nuclear power plants. A huge amount of spent nuclear fuel has accumulated around the world as a result of the operation of nuclear power plants. Eventually it will be dumped into the ocean, where it is least costly to the dumpers, and where economics take precedence. The amount is estimated to be about 500 becquerels per liter of seawater worldwide. The allowable level of radioactive materials in tap water is usually 1 becquerel per liter. Therefore, 500 becquerels is a level of radioactive contamination that cannot be ceased by human DNA. As a result, normal human DNA growth will not be possible. There is no greater inconvenience to normal human life. Therefore, the biggest problem for humans today is environmental contamination by spent nuclear fuel. It is not heat and external exposure from the atomic bombs. It is internal exposure due to absorption of radioactive materials in the body. The next biggest problem is the creation of carbon life (genetic engineering) and silicon life (AI) by humans, although I will leave the details for another time. The roll of self-destruction for Homo sapiens has been thrown.

It is the scientific and technological civilization advanced by "modern Western philosophy" that has created this problem. The question that should be asked is whether scientific and technological civilization has made human beings richer and happier. The scientific and technological civilization that has created a world that is frightened by the destruction of the world by the atomic bomb and tries to endure radioactive environmental pollution by nuclear power plants has amplified and prolonged human suffering and made people unhappy. Is this an inevitable consequence of "modern Western philosophy"? Is "modern Western philosophy" a philosophy that threatens human peace? Looking at the world before us today, we must conclude that it is. It is the end point of "modern Western philosophy," which has separated body and soul, abandoned the idea of life and death, promoted anthropocentrism, and subjugated nature. Our world is already in the "age of lead," a further aggravation of the "age of iron" that Hesiod described in "Labor and Days" before 2700. We must now return to the starting point of the life purpose of life (the origin of life) and question this. Our urgent task is to recognize what is wrong with "modern Western philosophy" and to think of a "human philosophy" to replace it.

The "philosophy of man" is based on the five assumptions I have outlined above. Let me explain each assumption one by one.

The first assumption is that "we are not alone. Here, "we" refers to both humans and life. Earth is a tiny little planet belonging to the solar system of the Milky Way Galaxy. Within the Milky Way Galaxy there are countless solar system-like star systems. The Milky Way Galaxy is just one of the countless galaxies in the universe. It is said that this universe is also innumerable and forms a multiverse. In short, both the earth and human beings, in this world (ka) and the next world (ba), exist only for a minuscule moment in time. It is human beings who want to ignore this scientific fact and indulge in the illusion that they are the greatest. The perception is wrong. Of all life on earth, only humans have this illusion.

The second assumption is that "we are a carbon family. In this case, "we" refers to life. All existing life is a carbon-bonded organic compound. The definition of life has not been determined, but the "philosophy of man" defines life as that which replicates and multiplies. By this definition, viruses are life. Not only is there life, but viruses are the most numerous organisms on the planet, with an estimated 31 to the power of 10. Humans, by the way, are within the 10th power of 10. Therefore, viruses outnumber humans to the 21st power of 10.

The third assumption is "we live to copy. In this case, "we" is life. The sole "life purpose" of life (the raison d'etre of survival) is "self-replication. Since non-human life has no so-called "language," its "behavior" is easy to understand, and it is easily observed that it concentrates on metabolism and replication for "self-replication. This is evident when we look at the growth of bacteria under the microscope and the growth of viruses under the electron microscope. Although we talk about altruism and altruism, life is ultimately just striving for "self-replication. The "human philosophy" believes that this instruction to "self-replicate" is written in the DNA. In "human philosophy," this genomic code that seems to be written in DNA is called "cosmic will. Before the emergence of molecular biology as a universal science, philosophy was based on mathematics, physics, and chemistry as sciences, forming a philosophical system. In "human philosophy," molecular biology was added to the new universal sciences to form a philosophical system. In "modern Western philosophy," Descartes, Kant, and Hegel referred to the "cosmic will" as "reason," Schopenhauer and Nietzsche as "will," and Heidegger as "existence. Philosophy without knowledge of molecular biology is a conundrum, because we are talking in "words" without science, imagining the existence and role of DNA. In recent decades, amazing advances in the field of molecular biology have made it possible to talk about philosophy in a way that anyone can understand. This is because we are one step closer to understanding the "purpose of life" hidden in DNA through the actions and consequences of life and genome analysis. The "philosophy of man" postulates that the "purpose of life (cosmic will)" hidden in DNA is "self-replication.

The fourth assumption can be expressed as "we are made by viruses. Viruses are presumed to hide in comets in space. This is because it provides the most stable environment for viruses. It is not easy to kill the virus completely. It is probably impossible. Thus, even in space, which is harsh for life, viruses are not afraid of it. Viruses can live almost indefinitely in space. Viruses have no metabolic mechanisms. They "self-replicate" by hijacking the metabolic mechanisms of invading cells. Until the time of its "action," it can enjoy a long and endless vacation at its leisure. Since the virus does not eat, it does not mind losing its job. All it has to do is sleep and wait until it gets a chance. This is the most energy-saving viral way of life.

Viruses invade specific target cells and "self-replicate" by hijacking the metabolic mechanisms of those cells. In a sense, it relies on the target cell that suits it to "self-replicate". This is the most important feature of viruses. Viruses cannot "self-replicate" unless they invade specific (selective) cells. It cannot just take any cell. It is extremely picky and selective. Therefore, when there is an abundance of target cells of its own choice, the virus will aggressively invade the cells, "self-replicate," and repeatedly destroy the cells. When the virus runs out of its preferred cells, it can no longer "self-replicate. When the virus senses this danger, it is known to internalize itself into the genome of the cell and become completely dependent on the cell for "self-replication. From the virus's point of view, this means that the virus leaves "self-replication" to ultra-slow cell division. There are traces of such viruses in about 9% of the human genome. These are viruses that attacked humans in the past and drove them to the brink of extinction. There are about 34% of viruses that have been internalized by fragmented viruses. Thus, viruses carry DNA and RNA into the genomes of all life. This is what makes life diverse. It is now believed that viral evolution is a far more powerful driving force in the evolution of life than Darwinian evolution by mutation and selection.

The "human philosophy" is that all life has a common "life purpose. I will not go into details here (fifth assumption), but there is not a separate "life purpose" for each life form, but a common "life purpose" for all life forms. What is it? It is quite simple and clear: the continuation of life, the "self-replication" of DNA. And it must be contained within the DNA genome. In "human philosophy," it is called "cosmic will. I believe that the "life purpose" of human beings and their DNA are the same as those of other lives. As far as the anthropocentric "modern Western philosophy" is concerned, this is unacceptable because human beings are special beings who have been given "reason" or "will" by God. The truth will ultimately be revealed by science, as it was in the age of geocentrism. Looking at the progress of molecular biology and astrophysics, it does not seem so far-fetched. Only then, I think, will it be too late to recognize "modern Western philosophy" as a local, microcosmic philosophy.

The "philosophy of man" tells us to face the fact that human "behavior" is infinitely viral. The human genome is written with 3 billion pairs of GCAT bases. It is the job of the future scientists to figure out what this means. The human genome is an academic term, but if we put it into plain human language, and if we look at human "behavior" historically, the human genome is a book aptly titled "Greed and Jealousy. The title of the human genome, our life text, is "Greed and Jealousy. It is so embarrassing that we are tempted to rationalize it with "words". However, although such concealment has been a tradition since Plato and Descartes, human philosophy tells us that it is time to put an end to such concealment and, considering the inconvenience to other life forms, it is time to show "knowing enough" through our "actions.

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
